NARRATIVE:

On 9-14-2012 at about 2340 hours I was dispatched to the area of 56 Sea Terrace, in the City of Dana Point in reference to a woman screaming and the sound of a gunshot. Prior to arriving on scene, I was further advised by Orange County Dispatch that the incident involved an Orange County Deputy Sheriff who had taken a suspect into custody.

After I arrived on scene, I was advised by Deputy J. Daruvala that the incident occurred when Deputy M. Matranga and his reserve partner Deputy E. Hernandez attempted to stop a black Nissan Maxima that appeared to have been in some type of traffic collision. The Nissan yielded in front of [REDACTED] and the driver exited from the vehicle with an unknown object in his hands. Deputy Matranga discharged one round from his duty weapon. Deputy Matranga's round missed the suspect and hit the apartment located at [REDACTED]. After Deputy Matranga discharged his weapon, the suspect dropped what was ever in his hands. Deputy Matranga took the suspect into custody and placed him in the backseat of his patrol car.

On 9-15-2012 at about 0500 hours I spoke with Deputy E. Hernandez by telephone. Deputy Hernandez told me the following: On 9-14-2012 he was participating in a roving D.U.I. patrol with Deputy M. Matranga. Deputy Matranga was driving a marked sheriff's patrol car and he was riding in the front passenger seat. At about 2340 hours they both observed a black 1998 Nissan Maxima, California license plate number [REDACTED] traveling north bound on Golden Lantern at Dana Woods. The Nissan was driving on a flat right front tire, there were branches stuck under the vehicle, the vehicle had front end damage and

Hernandez noticed the smell of burning rubber. Deputy Matranga maneuvered their patrol car behind the Maxima and attempted to stop the vehicle for suspected drunk driving. Deputy Matranga turned on the patrol car's steady red light, but instead of yielding, the Nissan turned west bound on Sea Brook and into the Sea Brook Apartment Complex. As the vehicle entered the apartment complex, Deputy Matranga turned on all of his patrol car's overhead flashing lights. The Maxima continued west bound on Sea Brook and turned north bound on [REDACTED]. The vehicle finally pulled into parking space number four in front of [REDACTED].

Deputy Matranga pulled their patrol car up behind the suspect's vehicle and both Hernandez and Matranga exited from the patrol car. Hernandez saw the driver exit from the Nissan. After the subject exited from the Nissan, he heard the sound of a handgun being discharged. The driver then dropped something that had been in his hands. Deputy Matranga approached the driver, handcuffed him and placed him in the backseat of their patrol car.

After I had been on scene for approximately five minutes, Sergeant D. Chewiwe asked me to have paramedics respond and examine the driver in order to ensure that he was not injured. After paramedics from the Orange County Fire Authority arrived on scene, I escorted them to Deputy Matranga's patrol car. I opened the left rear passenger door of Deputy Matranga's patrol car so the paramedics could examine our suspect, who had been identified as Christian T. Goodwin. As soon as I opened the left rear passenger door of Deputy Matranga's patrol car, I noticed the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from Goodwin. I also noticed that Goodwin's eyelids were extremely droopy, he seem extremely lethargic and he was either unwilling or unable to comply with my directives to exit from the vehicle.

With the assistance of the paramedics, Goodwin was helped out of the backseat of Deputy Matranga's patrol car. Goodwin had difficulty standing. Goodwin was unable to answer simple question asked of him by the paramedics. When the paramedics checked his pupils, I noticed that they were dilated to approximately 8 millimeters. An electro cardiogram showed that Goodwin had an abnormal heart beat and he would need to be transported to a hospital for additional medical treatment.

Goodwin was transported by ambulance to Saddleback Hospital in San Clemente. I rode in the ambulance with Goodwin for security reasons. During the trip to the hospital Goodwin seem to phase in and out of consciousness and his respirations dropped to eight per minute. I asked Goodwin if he had consumed anything besides alcohol. Although Goodwin speech was extremely slurred and difficult to understand, he told me that he had ingested heroine. When I asked Goodwin if he had actually ingested a "speedball," made of heroin and methamphetamine, he nodded "Yes." Prior to arriving at Saddleback Hospital, the paramedic on board the ambulance gave Goodwin an injection of Naloxone. Naloxone is used to counter the effects of heroin and is currently reference to as narcan. After the injection of Naloxone, Goodwin's respiration rate returned to normal levels.

Even after the injection of Naloxone Goodwin was still slurring his speech and even when I asked him his home address he was unable to reply.

E. Romberg 30 second estimation of time: Stand upright with your heels and toes together and hands at your sides. Tilt your head back and close your eyes. When I say begin, I want you to maintain this position for 30 seconds. When the 30 seconds are up, I want you to open your eyes, bring your head forward and look at me.

Results:

Goodwin was unable to stand, so the test could not be performed.

R. Walk and Turn: Stand with your left foot behind your right foot, with the toes of the left foot touching the heel of your right foot. Stand upright with your arms at your sides. When I say begin, take 9 steps forward, heel to toe, along this line, counting each step. On the last step leave the front foot in place and turn around making a three point pivot turn, to the left (*Counter Clockwise*). Then take 9 steps back along the line. Keep your arms and hands at your sides. Count your steps out loud. Look down at your feet during the entire test.

Results:

Goodwin was too intoxicated to stand, so the test could not be performed.

G. One Leg Stand 30 seconds, both feet: Stand with your heels and toes together and your hands at your sides. When I tell you to begin, raise your right leg about 6 inches off the ground and point your toes down. Keep your hands at your sides, look at your toes and count, starting at 1001. Do this until I tell you to stop.

Results:

Goodwin was too intoxicated to stand, so the test could not be performed.

H. Finger to Nose: Stand upright with your heels and toes together. Make a fist with both hands and extend your index fingers and keep them extended. Next I want you to place your hands at your sides and tilt your head back with your eyes closed. When I say begin, I want you to raise your index finger and touch the tip of your nose and bring it back down again, without being told. I will tell you which hand to use, so listen to my instructions.

Results:

Goodwin was too intoxicated to stand, so the test could not be performed.

I. Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN): Check for Smooth Pursuit, Nystagmus at Extreme and Angle of Onset.

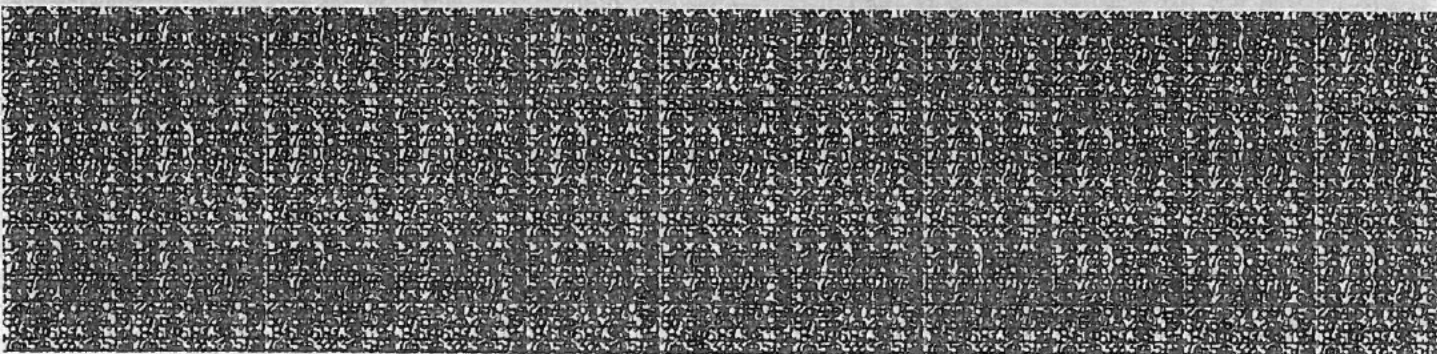

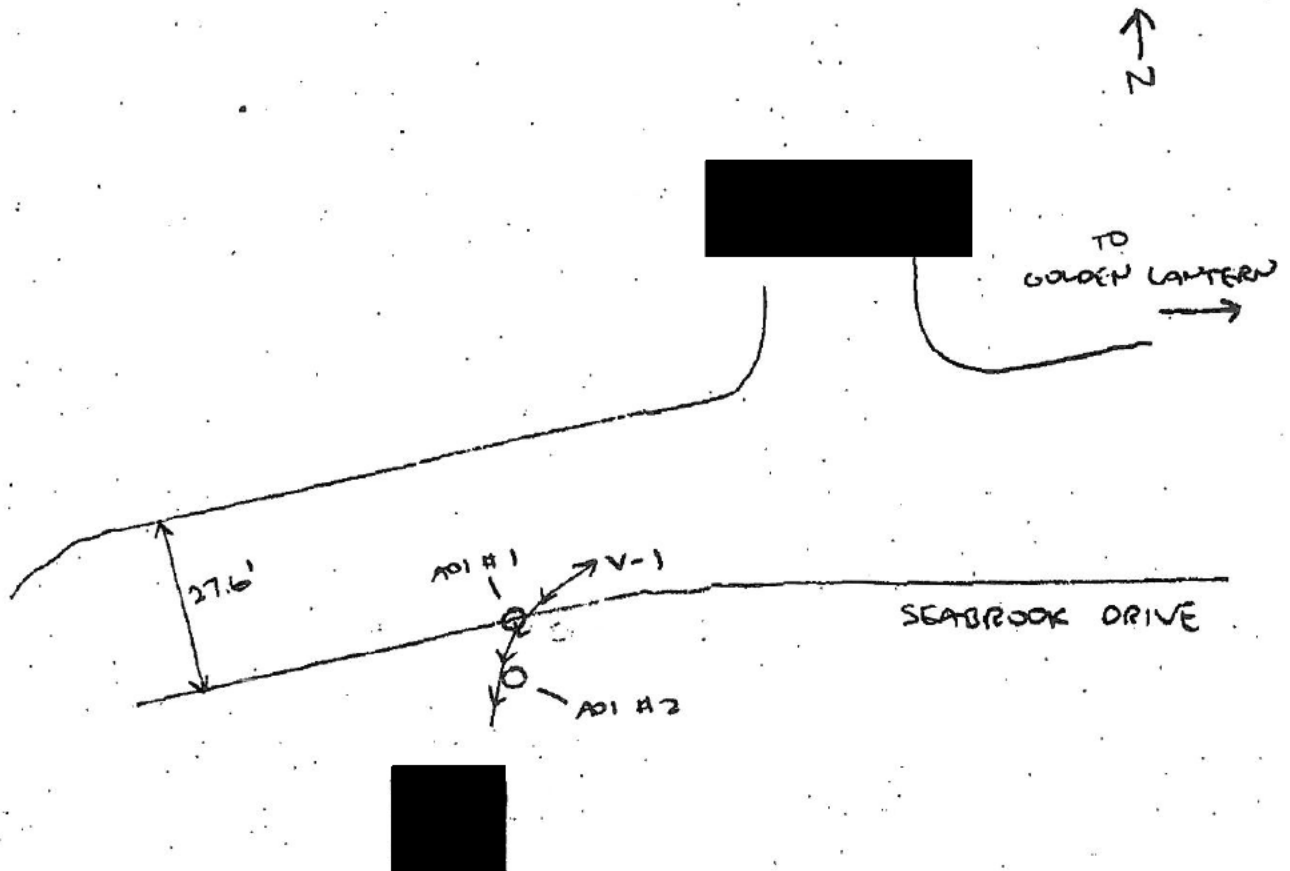

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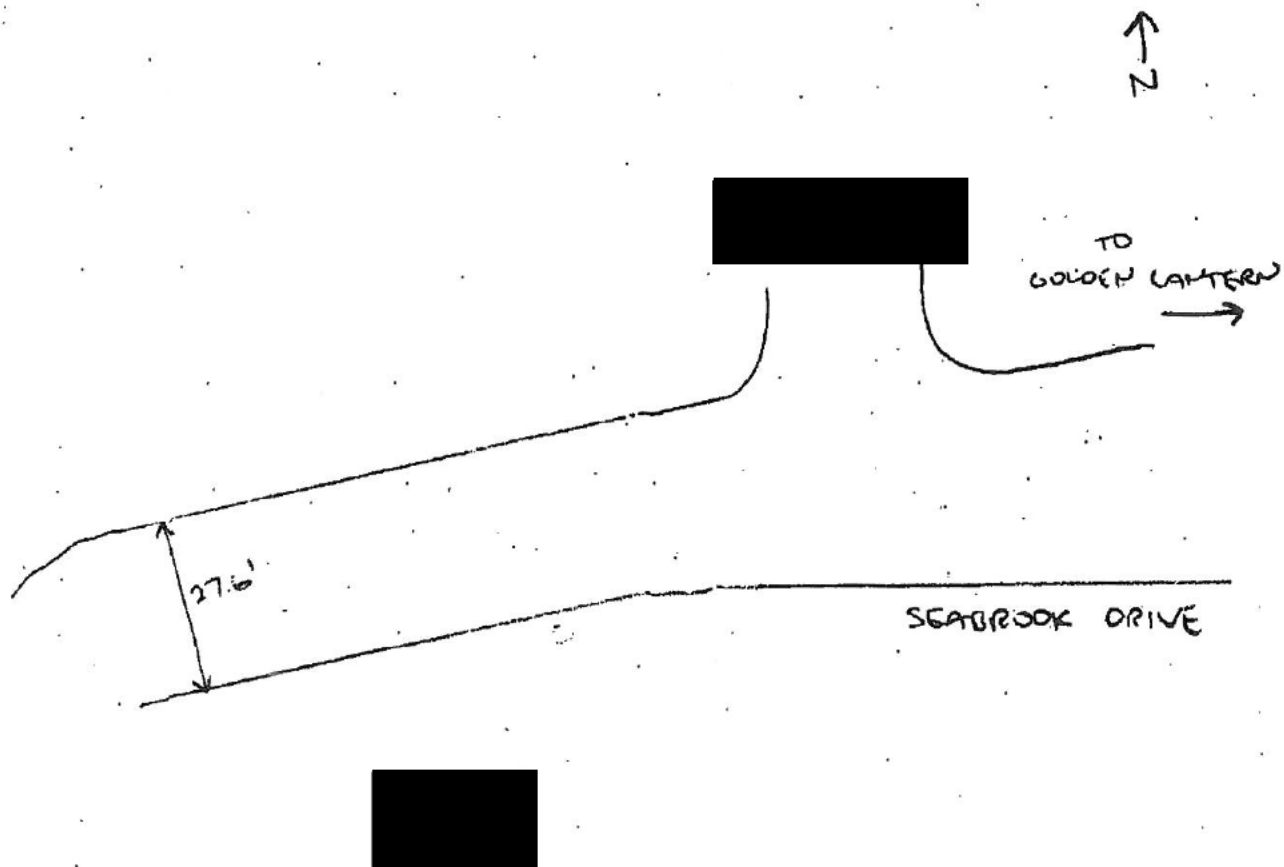

Dep. Daruvala determined a possible round was fired into a stucco fireplace at [REDACTED]. I assisted Dep. Daruvala and Dep. W. Simandl #5000 in determining no one was hurt or injured from [REDACTED] or any other apartment in the area. I then helped maintain the crime scene until homicide arrived.

At approximately 2342 hours, Deputies were dispatched to [REDACTED]. Several different informants were advising of a woman screaming and a gunshot.

Deputy S. Hilliard and I arrived at about the same time. We found Deputy M. Matranga and Deputy E. Hernandez at the scene. They appeared to have a car stopped which was parked in a parking stall. They had a handcuffed suspect in the back seat of their patrol car.

I told Matranga that we were dispatched a call of a gunshot. Matranga advised me that he had discharged his weapon. I advised Matranga not to make a statement about the shooting at that time, but that I needed to know how many shots were fired, if anyone was injured, and where the bullet went. Matranga told me he fired one shot and that the suspect was not hit. We checked the apartment located at [REDACTED] and found a bullet hole in the chimney.

A neighbor told me that [REDACTED] was an unoccupied unit. I knocked on the door but there was no answer.

I told Matranga that the Association of Orange County Deputy Sheriff's needed to be notified. I gave him the phone number and he made the phone call.

I checked the apartment directly above the location [REDACTED]. No one in that unit was injured. I checked the apartment directly behind the location [REDACTED]. No one was hurt at that location. [REDACTED] was the resident. She was inside the apartment and did not see or hear anything. I also spoke with her brother [REDACTED], and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated they were standing on the patio at the time of the incident. They did not see the incident because the patio faces another direction.

An apartment manager responded to the location at our request. She had a key to [REDACTED] but advised us that it was occupied by a temporary lodger. We again knocked on the door. The occupants came to the door and said no one was injured. I checked the inside of the residence and the chimney. I did not find the exit hole for the bullet. It appeared that the bullet stopped in the wall of the Chimney.

Sergeant Chewiwe arrived a few minutes later and took over command of the crime scene.

At approximately 0200 hours, a briefing was given by Sgt. Chiewie who was the patrol supervisor at the time of the incident. Sgt. Chiewie said that Deputies C. Matranga and E. Hernandez were working as a two man unit when they conducted a car stop on a black Nissan Maxima inside the apartment complex. The vehicle was occupied by one male subject, later identified as Christian Tyler Goodwin [REDACTED]. The vehicle stopped on the south side of apartment [REDACTED], car port [REDACTED]. Deputy Matranga stopped the marked black and white patrol car behind the Nissan. As Deputy Matranga exited his patrol car, Christian exited his vehicle and charged toward Deputy Matranga. 1 After the crash, [REDACTED] heard a female voice scream and yell something to the effect of, "You
2 are an idiot" and "what's the matter with you?" [REDACTED] then saw four subjects (early twenties
3 or teenagers) come from the pool area. One of the subjects said, "He's an idiot" and got into a
4 red truck (NFD) with the other three subjects. The subjects did not seem to be in a "hurry"

INTERVIEW OF RESERVE DEPUTY E. HERNANDEZ:

On September 15, 2012 at approximately 0400 hours, Investigator K. Hoffman and I interviewed Reserve Deputy E. Hernandez at Dana Point City Hall. Deputy Hernandez agreed to speak with us regarding the car stop which resulted in an Officer Involved Shooting. The interview was digitally recorded and a copy was subsequently booked into Sheriff's Property. It should be noted that at approximately 0445 hours, my digital recorder 'beeped' that the memory was full so we continued the interview on Investigator K. Hoffman's digital recorder. The following is a summary of that interview.

Deputy Hernandez was wearing his Class A Sheriff's uniform which included patches on both short sleeves and a badge located near his front left shirt pocket. He was also wearing his Sam Brown belt which contained a taser, collapsible baton, flashlight, his sidearm, two magazines, handcuffs, pepper spray and his pac-set (number 0131). He later told us his partner Deputy M. Matranga was wearing a black polo shirt that had Sheriff patches sewed on each short sleeve and a badge sewn on the polo shirt near his upper left chest area.

Deputy Hernandez is a classified Reserve II which means he attended a 240 hour academy that began in January of 2012 and concluded in April of 2012. A Level II Reserve gives Hernandez the opportunity to work a patrol position. He works approximately 30 hours per month. This evening was the fourth occasion he worked as a DUI Rover unit. Hernandez also has full-time job besides being a Reserve Deputy.

Tonight he was partnered with Deputy M. Matranga; he had also been partnered with him in the recent past. His job description was to augment Deputy Matranga and to be his cover deputy while they were patrolling this evening. They patrol the entire South County region. There were approximately eight DUI Roving units patrolling tonight. They had briefing at 1900 hours at the Aliso Viejo Sub-Station; they were in service at approximately 1930 hours. They were issued patrol unit 2647.

I asked Deputy Hernandez to describe the events that lead to the shooting. At approximately midnight, they were driving on Golden Lantern when they observed a black Maxima; the windows were tinted. Deputy Hernandez thought that vehicle pulled out of a side street then drove in front of them. The Maxima was dragging tree branches from the rear wheels. He also

smelled burnt rubber, saw that the front passenger side appeared damaged, and he also noticed the front passenger tire was flat. Deputy Matranga drove behind the vehicle and they followed it for a short distance (He thought it was 800 yards) when the Maxima turned left into a complex (Sea Brook Apartments). As the Maxima was pulling into the complex, Deputy Matranga engaged the overhead take-down lights of the patrol unit. While the Maxima was driving through the complex it did not slow down but at times it would speed up then slow down again. Deputy Hernandez felt the Maxima was failing to stop. All of a sudden the Maxima pulled into a carport parking stall so Deputy Matranga stopped behind the Maxima. The patrol take-down lights (red) were still on and the spot lights were also on.

As they have done in the past, Deputy Hernandez walked on the passenger side of the Maxima and Deputy Matranga was going to contact the driver. While Deputy Hernandez was near the back bumper of the Maxima, he observed the driver "charge toward Mike", and then he heard a "pop". Initially, he did not think it was a gunshot because the sound was so subtle. Deputy Hernandez expounded and said the driver took a step and a half quickly toward his partner before he was subdued. He felt that the suspect was going to harm Deputy Matranga. After Deputy Hernandez confirmed there were no other passengers in the car, he immediately went to assist Deputy Matranga.

By the time he reached Deputy Matranga, Deputy Matranga had controlled the suspect in a rear wrist lock and was conducting a cursory search of the suspect. Deputy Matranga asked the suspect why he charged at him and the suspect answered, "I don't know, I don't know, I'm sorry, I'm sorry". Deputy Matranga handcuffed the suspect and placed him in the backseat of their patrol unit. Deputy Matranga also asked the suspect if he needed medical aide but the suspect declined.

Deputy Hernandez was requested to keep an eye on the suspect. Other than that, he and Deputy Matranga never communicated after the shooting. Deputy Hernandez never saw Deputy Matranga's sidearm unholstered nor did he know for sure that Deputy Matranga had fired his handgun. He ultimately assumed that Deputy Matranga had fired his handgun because of all the Sheriff's personnel who showed up.

Deputy Hernandez noted that after about thirty minutes, the suspect seemed to be "passing out" while in the back seat of the patrol unit. The suspect "keeled" over to his right side, Deputy Hernandez could see that the suspect was still breathing. Deputy Hernandez relayed this information to a Sergeant and the Sergeant requested he pull the suspect out of the patrol unit. Deputy Hernandez opened the back door of the patrol unit and told the suspect to exit the vehicle. Deputy Hernandez stood the suspect up but he was swaying, he also smelled alcohol on the suspect's breath. They decided to call medics out to examine the suspect who subsequently treated him then transported the suspect to Saddleback Hospital.

Reserve Deputy Hernandez said prior to this suspect's patrol stop, he stated that they made approximately 12 or 13 other stops. They had not arrested anyone prior to this stop. They had cleared a patrol stop approximately five minutes before first observing the Maxima.

Deputy Hernandez stated he had been trained on identifying subjects who are under the influence. His opinion was that the suspect was under the influence. His opinion is based on the fact the suspect was acting, "Rubbery", he smelled alcohol on his breath, and he was "swaying" to the point where Deputy Hernandez had to hold him up. He added that the suspect's motor skills were impaired, loose and unstable. He observed these symptoms when he pulled the suspect out of the patrol unit which was approximately twenty minutes after the suspect was placed in the patrol unit.

The interview concluded at approximately 0500 hours.

32 number [REDACTED] called on 9/15/12 at 1113 hours. I spoke to her on 9/18. [REDACTED] stated the
33 driver jumped the curb and the vehicle came to rest immediately outside her apartment (next to her
34 sleeping daughter's bedroom) and the incident terrified her [REDACTED] daughter. [REDACTED] was
35 awake and inside her apartment when she heard the sound of screeching tires. She is not sure how

1 the driver lost control of the car, but the vehicle left the roadway and landed in the greenbelt
2 immediately adjacent to her apartment. She looked out her window and could see the driver trying to
3 free the vehicle and people around the vehicle. She stated the gas lines were next to the residence
4 and she feared if the driver went forward he could break the gas lines. [REDACTED] went out onto her
5 porch and began screaming at people to take the driver's keys away from him, but the driver would
6 not stop. The driver was eventually able to free his vehicle from the greenbelt and left the complex.
7 Moments later she saw the vehicle come back into the complex, and drive up [REDACTED] She did
8 not see the vehicle stop but did hear the gunshot. She was not immediately certain if it was a gunshot
9 or backfire. She stated other people, who may have been associated with the driver, was a woman
10 with long dark hair driving a dark PT Cruiser type vehicle. Another vehicle possibly involved was a
11 dark, possibly navy blue pickup.

12 [REDACTED] phone number [REDACTED] stated she and her friend [REDACTED]
13 [REDACTED] returned from a concert at approximately 2230-2300 hours and saw approximately 10
14 juveniles hanging around a dark 4x4 type truck and a car that was parked behind the truck on
15 Seabrook. They were obstructing traffic in and out of the area. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went back out for

17 [REDACTED] phone number [REDACTED] stated she was on her balcony

26 [REDACTED] there was no answer and I left a business card, on 9/21/12 at approximately 1005 hours I
27 spoke to [REDACTED] who called me. This call was not recorded. [REDACTED]
28 stated she has moved out of the residence and found the card today when she went to conduct an
29 inspection of the property. [REDACTED] stated no one was at the residence on 9/14/12, and no one has
30 been at the residence for approximately two weeks.

31 [REDACTED] phone number [REDACTED] told me he saw the incident
32 and even followed the vehicle. He was working on his computer last night and his desk is right by
33 the patio. He stated he kept hearing people that sounded like they were "partying" and hearing cars
34 "peeling out." He thought they were rowdy high schoolers, trying to race each from the west end of
35 Seabrook. He stated the "peeling out" kept going on and on, until he heard one that was really loud.

1 There were people arguing, then heard the squealing tires. He looked out his patio and saw a vehicle
2 coming eastbound on Seabrook at what he estimated to be 50-60 MPH. The driver hit the speed
3 bump, jumped the curb and crashed into the greenbelt. People who appeared to be with the driver ran
4 up to the car. [REDACTED] stated he went down to where the vehicle came to a rest with some other
5 neighbors. The driver had gotten hung up on a rock. The driver would not stop be kept going forward
6 and reverse in the car, trying to get loose from the rock. [REDACTED] stated he along with a number of
7 other people were yelling at the driver trying to get him to stop, but the driver would not give up.
8 [REDACTED] stated he almost got hit by the driver. The driver was looking at [REDACTED] and saw he was
9 young, but the driver completely ignored everyone. The driver was not calming down but was erratic.
10 There appeared to be some girls who knew the driver who left east on Seabrook. [REDACTED] was
11 behind the car when the driver put the car in reverse and [REDACTED] had to get out of the way. The
12 driver is eventually able to get out of the rocks, then drove west on Seabrook and out onto Golden
13 Lantern. [REDACTED] and a couple other neighbors chased after him. He did not think the driver was

1 message. I called him back on 9/15 and spoke to him. [REDACTED] told me he slept the entire evening and
2 did not hear anything about the incident until he spoke with neighbors in the morning.

4 [REDACTED] (respectively) phone number
5 [REDACTED] I spoke with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in their living room. They stated at approximately
6 2300 hours, they had gone to bed. They heard the noise of tires screeching, about five seconds later
7 they heard another screeching noise and a 'smash.' [REDACTED] stated she heard the sounds of a female
8 voice stating, "...that is my boyfriend", she did not see the girl who was making that statement. They
9 ran out and [REDACTED] met a neighbor (most likely [REDACTED]). They found the vehicle in the greenbelt,
10 trying to get away. People were around the car screaming 'get out of the car', people were also

17 other. [REDACTED] stated a neighbor is familiar with the truck (they did not know which unit the
18 neighbor lived at, I left them business cards to give to the neighbor when they see him). [REDACTED]
19 believes it was a red pickup truck (later described as almost lowered mini-style / compact truck).
20 [REDACTED] and the neighbor ran after the vehicle that turned right onto Golden Lantern trying to get the

29 again if they have any conversations with the neighbors about the incident to ask them to call me.

5 **NARRATIVE:**

6 On Saturday, 09-15-12, at approximately 0040 hours, Sgt. Spencer called me and said there had been
 7 a Deputy involved shooting in the city of Dana Point. He asked me to respond to the scene to assist
 8 in the investigation. At approximately 0200 hours, Sergeant Chewiwie briefed us on the incident.
 9 After the briefing, Sgt. Spencer assigned Inv. Hatch and me to interview the suspect, Christian
 10 Goodwin, and the deputy involved in the shooting, Deputy Mike Matranga. We first interviewed
 11 Goodwin at the hospital (see follow-up by Inv. Longnecker, same DR#).

12 At approximately 0400 hours, Inv. Hatch and I arrived at the Dana Point City Hall for an interview
 13 with Deputy Mike Matranga. Present during the interview were AOCDS Attorney David
 14 Goldwasser, Inv. Hatch, Dep. Matranga, and I. The interview took place inside a conference room
 15 and was digitally recorded. The following is a summary of the interview:

16 Matranga agreed to give us a free and voluntary statement.

17 Matranga told us that he had been an Orange County Deputy Sheriff for fourteen (14) years. He has
 18 no previous law enforcement experience. He said he has been on patrol since November 2006, and
 19 has been assigned to city of Lake Forest the entire time. He worked in a patrol vehicle for almost
 20 three (3) years, and then became a motor deputy and has been in that assignment for almost three (3)
 21 years.

22 Matranga told us that tonight his call sign was #6842 and he was working an overtime shift in a DUI
 23 car with Reserve Deputy Hernandez. They were assigned to Laguna Hills/Laguna Woods/Laguna

1 Niguel/Aliso Viejo. He said he started the shift on September 14, at 1900 hours and was scheduled to
2 get off on September 15, at 0300 hours. Matranga said he had worked with Hernandez on one other
3 occasion.

4 I asked Matranga how many hours of sleep he slept before his shift. He said he slept on Thursday
5 (09-13-12) night for seven or eight hours. He said he woke up on Friday, September 14, 2012, at
6 0645 hours and has not slept since.

7 Matranga said after briefing at the Aliso Viejo Substation, they got something to eat at about 2000
8 hours. He said he ate a seared ahi tuna rice bowl. He had not eaten since then. He and Hernandez
9 made approximately sixteen (16) car stops before the shooting.

10 Matranga said he was driving westbound Golden Lantern and came into Dana Point. He decided to
11 turn around and go back to their assigned area. He did not know where he made the u-turn, but he
12 knew he turned into a Chevron gas station and headed back eastbound on Golden Lantern. Matranga
13 saw a black compact 4-door vehicle make a u-turn in front of him (but did not cut him off). He saw
14 damage to the right front of the vehicle, the right front tire was flat, and there was brush under the
15 front and back of the vehicle. He saw three to five people on the other side of the street that appeared
16 to be chasing the vehicle on foot. He said one of the people was a male, but he was unsure the sexes
17 of the others. He could not describe what the people were wearing.

18 Matranga said the driver of the black vehicle turned left into a condominium complex. He said he did
19 not know the name of the complex because he has never worked in the city of Dana Point. He said
20 he thought the driver of the vehicle had been in some type of vehicle crash. Deputy Matranga
21 activated his emergency lights, and the driver continued driving straight into the complex. He said
22 then the driver made a right turn and then an immediate left turn. When the driver made the left turn,
23 he was looking out his driver's side window at Matranga. Matranga did not know if the window was
24 rolled down at the time, but after the car stop he noticed the window was rolled down. Matranga said
25 after the driver turned left, the car accelerated and Matranga thought the driver was trying to get away

Matranga told Hernandez that he thought the driver was going to run. Matranga parked his patrol vehicle approximately one (1) foot behind the vehicle's rear bumper. Matranga said since he expected the driver to run, he thought he would get out of the vehicle, "side step," and run. He said all the training videos he has seen have taught him this. He said he has had people run away from him before and that is how they do it. He said he saw the driver open the driver's door, get out of the vehicle, and he "spun around and squared up toward me." Matranga thought the driver was going to come at him. Matranga saw a "black shiny object" in the driver's hand.

Matranga said when he got out of his patrol vehicle, he left his driver's door open, and went to the area of his front left fender. I asked Matranga to explain what he meant by "squared up." Matranga said when the driver got out of his vehicle, the driver turned and faced him, including his feet and shoulders. He said the driver was hunched a little bit. He said the driver's "hand came around," possibly his right hand, and he saw a black shiny object in his hand. Matranga remembered the overhead lights "glinting" off this "metallic object" in the driver's hand.

Matranga said he is a Motor Deputy and he always runs scenarios through his head. He said he has learned that people that run away from police officers "side step and run," and people that fight or shoot, "square up and shoot." He said from what he saw the driver do tonight, the driver squared up on him. I asked Matranga if the driver ever raised his hands up toward him. He said the driver raised his hands up into a 90 degree angle above his waistband area.

Matranga told us that when the driver got out of the vehicle, he was still in the driver's door area. I asked him how many feet he thought he was away from the driver. He said somewhere between 15-20 feet. He said because of the lighting, he had a good visual of the driver. Matranga said when he got out of his patrol vehicle and ran around his door, he put his hand on his gun. He saw the driver get out of his vehicle, square up, and he saw what he thought was a gun in his hand to shoot him. Matranga drew his weapon, did not take up a sight picture, and shot his gun in the direction of the driver. Matranga said he thought he only used one hand to shoot his gun. He said as the round went off, the driver dropped what was in his hands, and he saw the driver's open palms. Matranga did not continue to shoot. The driver, without commands, turned around (away from Matranga), sat down on the ground, and put his hands behind his back.

1 I asked Matranga if he was in fear of his life, and he said, "Absolutely." Attorney Goldwasser asked
2 Matranga if he was in fear for Hernandez's life. Matranga said he was more concerned about his own
3 life because the driver squared up on him, not Hernandez.

4 I asked Matranga if he gave the driver any verbal commands during the incident. He said at one
5 point when he was standing in front of his opened driver's door, he told the driver, "Show me your
6 hands." Matranga said he did not say any other type of commands to the driver. After the driver sat
7 on the ground, he saw the driver's hands were empty, he saw some keys with a black carabineer near
8 his hands on the ground. Matranga holstered his weapon and handcuffed the driver immediately. He
9 said he conducted a pat-down search, and took a wallet and cell phone out of his pocket and put it on
10 the trunk of the vehicle. Matranga was looking for weapons and to see if he had been hit by the

1 it could have been between 20-25 mph. Matranga thought the driver was trying to evade him.
2 Matranga denied that the driver ever ran toward him.
3 Inv. Hatch asked Matranga if the uniform he had on during our interview is what he had on during
4 the incident, and he said yes. Matranga said he was wearing a black polo shirt, with the words
5 "Orange County Sheriff" in yellow with a yellow Sheriff's star on both shoulders sleeves, on the right
6 breast pocket there is a city of Lake Forest seal, and "Deputy M. Matranga" in gold writing, and on
7 the left breast pocket there is an embroidered badge and above it says, "Lake Forest Police Services,"
8 and below it states his PID number, "5109." On the back of his shirt the word, "Sheriff" was written
9 in large letters. Inv. Hatch asked Matranga to describe what was on his duty belt. Matranga says he
10 was wearing his department issued green 511 BDU pants, black basket-weaved gun belt, (starting to
11 the left of his belt buckle and moving to the back) a triple magazine holder, a taser holster, PVS

27 shooting.

8 **NARRATIVE:**

9 On September 15, 2012, at about 0255 hours, Inv. Hatch and I went to the San Clemente Hospital
10 where the driver, Christian Goodwin [REDACTED] was being treated in Room #7. We spoke to
11 Goodwin while he was seated on his hospital bed. Our conversation was digitally recorded and the
12 following is a summary.

13 I introduced myself and Inv. Hatch to Goodwin. Goodwin asked me if he was under arrest and I told
14 him he was. I told him that I needed to read him his rights and he said he knew his rights "to all three
15 of them." I told him that I had to read them to him anyways. I read Goodwin his Miranda rights and
16 he answered "Yep" to the questions.

17 I asked Goodwin when he woke up this morning and he said he did not know. I asked him what his
18 last memory was and he said, "Beer pong." Goodwin said he did not know when, where, or with
19 whom he was playing beer pong. Goodwin then told us that it was somewhere in his apartment
20 complex. The next memory he had was when he was driving to his complex. I asked Goodwin what
21 drugs he used today, and he said he smoked heroin, methamphetamine, marijuana, and drank alcohol.
22 He said he smoked "a point or two" of heroin sometime on Friday. Goodwin said he has been
23 smoking heroin for only a month. He said he had only used methamphetamine around five times in

1 his life and he only smoked a little of that today. I asked him if he smoked the drugs and alcohol all
2 on the same day and he said yes. Goodwin said he knew he drank hard alcohol because of the way it
3 tasted. He did not know if he drank it in a mixed drink or drank it straight. He did not know how he
4 smoked the marijuana. Goodwin said he did not think he bought the drugs today. He said he was
5 addicted to heroin and always smoked it.

6 Goodwin said he drove a black Nissan Maxima. He only remembered driving to his complex and
7 parking. He said he believed he parked his vehicle by the "top main pool." He did not remember
8 being pulled over by a police vehicle.

9 I asked Goodwin who he usually hung out with at his complex and might have been playing beer
10 pong with tonight. He said he thought he was with his girlfriend but he was not sure. He said his
11 girlfriend's name is [REDACTED] He said she was eighteen years old and she lived in the [REDACTED]
12 in the city of San Juan Capistrano. He gave me permission to go in his cell phone to look for her
13 number (Inv. Hatch later looked at Goodwin's phone, but it was password protected). He did not
14 know her address and he only had been dating her for a few weeks.

15 Goodwin said he would never let anyone else drive his vehicle. He said he had lived in the complex
16 for three (3) years. He said he worked at the [REDACTED] in the city of Dana Point. Goodwin said he
17 did not work yesterday. Goodwin said he started to "party" sometime Friday afternoon, but was
18 unable to give us anymore specifics. He said he remembered he drove from Marina Hills Drive to
19 Sea Brook between 2100 and 2200 hours. He said he thought he went to someone's residence
20 because the party was not at his residence. He did not know why he was on Marina Hills.

21 Goodwin said the deputy at the hospital told him that he drove into some plants. Goodwin told us
22 that he did not remember crashing at any point. Goodwin said he did not feel injured. Inv. Hatch

2 him his drugs. I asked Goodwin if he owns a handcuff key and he said no. I told him that we found a
3 key in the backseat of the patrol vehicle and he said it was not his. Goodwin said he did not
4 remember being seated in the backseat of a patrol vehicle.
- 5 Goodwin said he remembered seeing his girlfriend at the party where he was playing beer pong. He
6 did not remember saying goodbye to her last night. He said the party was inside a garage and inside
7 his apartment complex.

9 summary:

10 Dep. Villeneuve told me that he is the Administrator for the Orange County DUI (Driving Under the
11 Influence) Task Force events. He said on September 14, 2012, he was in charge of the DUI event. I
12 asked him what occurred that night. He said he was monitoring the police radio, and heard a portion
13 of one of Dep. Matranga's transmissions where he stated he needed a supervisor as soon as possible.
14 Dep. Villeneuve asked Sgt. Paul Wade (who was sitting next to him) if he thought he needed to
15 respond. They decided that Villeneuve would call Dep. Matranga to determine if they needed to
16 respond. Villeneuve called Dep. Matranga's cell phone and asked him if he was okay, and Matranga

10 On October 16, 2012 at approximately 1500 hours, I spoke to [REDACTED] on the telephone and our
11 conversation was digitally recorded. The following is a summary of what he told me:

12 [REDACTED] told me on the night of the incident, he was living at [REDACTED] in the city of Dana Point.

13 He had gone to bed, but was not asleep, and heard someone doing "donuts." He heard a woman
14 yelling, "Just leave," and "Get out of here." He went outside and saw the woman yelling at the man
